



Dr. Michael Edney is the Program Manager of the Applied Barley Research Unit in the Grain Research Laboratory of the Canadian Grain Commission, Winnipeg, Canada. He first joined the Canadian Grain Commission as a Post-Doctoral Fellow in 1988. In 1990, he was hired by the Grain Research Laboratory (GRL) as its first Feed Grain Research Scientist.

As Program Manager he is presently responsible for the quality of western Canadian barley.

Responsibilities include monitoring the quality of the new barley harvest each year as well as development, registration and promotion of new malting barley varieties. He also carries out research on the end-use quality of malting barley and the measurement of quality.

A native of Calgary, Alberta, Edney holds a Master of Science in poultry nutrition from the University of Saskatchewan and a PhD in malting and brewing science from the Technical University of Munich, Germany.

He recently completed a sabbatical year at the University of Adelaide in Australia where he investigated the effects of malting barley quality on fermentability.
